

Guidelines regarding the admission competition for the Bachelor's degree studies within the Faculty of Medicine on places with foreign currency fee for foreign citizens from EU third countries, in the sessions of July-September 2021

Foreign citizens (from EU third countries) can be enrolled in the admission competition for the Bachelor's degree study programmes taught in Romanian, only after completing a preparatory year of learning Romanian language or after acquiring the necessary knowledge of language proficiency according to the OUC's requirements.

During the preparatory year, candidates shall acquire both the necessary and specific knowledge of Romanian language, correlated with the future specialization, if the study programme is taught in Romanian. The Romanian language proficiency certificate or the Romanian Language Preparatory Year Certificate, as the case may be, is a mandatory prerequisite for the assessment of the application file with a view to establishing eligibility for the study programme requested. Exempted from this obligation are the categories of persons who prove, with school documents, that they attended the high school courses prior to enrolling in the Bachelor's degree study programme organized in Romanian.

With regard to the application file's evaluation, candidates will upload the documents on-line by submitting them to the OUC's Department for International Students (DIS-OUC) namely, to the online platform (<https://admitere.univ-ovidius.ro/>) in the International Students' section, according to the calendar established by the Admission Board and approved by the Senate. Documents in the digital application file shall correspond to the original ones.

Documents uploaded on-line shall observe the deadline requirements for the admission contest. Exceeding the deadline mentioned in the admission calendar shall result in the disqualification of the potential candidate. The processing and application fees are part of the file and must also be attached to it.

Registration of candidates who have been declared eligible for the admission competition is conducted by the Faculty's Admission Board, on submitting the files to the OUC's Department for International Students.

Foreign citizens (from EU third countries) shall be admitted according to the study documents they have submitted for the admission contest which includes an analysis stage

carried out according to the criteria included in the “Evaluation and selection grid of self-paying foreign citizens from EU, EEA and CH third countries for the admission competition for the Bachelor’s degree study programs taught in Romanian”.

Following the hierarchy thus established, the number of application files corresponding to the number of student places approved by the Romanian Agency for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (ARACIS) will be forwarded to the Ministry of Education for granting the Letter of Acceptance. Registration of this category of candidates for the admission competition is made in accordance with the provisions of the “Regulation regarding the organization and conduct of the admission competition for Bachelor and Master studies at “Ovidius” University of Constanța in the sessions of July and September 2021” and the “Methodology for organizing the admission competition for Bachelor’s degree study programs at the “Ovidius” University of Constanța, the Faculty of Medicine in the sessions of July and September 2021” and is conditioned by observing the eligibility requirements for issuing /owning the “Letter of acceptance, the performance achievements gained during the previous study years and the academic activity of the candidate in the requested field.

The selection criteria may be partially or fully met, generating the scores accordingly. The evaluation board will validate and therefore, award points only for the activities evidenced by official documents.

The ranking of candidates with equal final scores shall be carried out in respect of:

- the average at the baccalaureate exam or other types of graduate diploma exams
- the average obtained in the discipline of biology / chemistry / physics during high school studies.

Guidelines regarding the conduct of the Admission Competition for the Bachelor's degree studies within the Faculty of Medicine, in the sessions of July -September 2021, for Medicine taught in English study program

I. Admission competition's session on places assigned to the Bachelor's degree study programs organized in English, within the Faculty of Medicine, for foreign citizens from EU, EEA and CH Member States.

The Study Recognition Certificate issued by the competent bodies of the Romanian Ministry of Education is a mandatory condition for the admission contest. For candidates who do not have a Study Recognition Certificate issued by the competent bodies of the Romanian Ministry of Education, the submission of files for eligibility assessment is carried out on-line in accordance with the calendar of admission, by forwarding them to the Department for International Students, namely to the on-line platform (<https://admitere.univ-ovidius.ro/>) at the international students' section (International Students), in line with the calendar established by the Board of Admission and approved by the Senate.

The Department for International Students submits the application files and the Study Recognition Certificate/ attestation in electronic format to the Faculties' Boards of Admission. Registration to the admission contest for 2021 is made by the Faculty's Board of Admission.

For Bachelor's degree study programs organized in English, the admission of foreign citizens from EU, EEA and CH Member States to the assigned places is conditioned by meeting the linguistic competence and admission contest requirements, which shall provide for an assessment stage of the application files carried out in accordance with the "Criteria grid for assessing the academic performance and personal achievements of self-paying foreign candidates from EU, EEA and EC Member States for the admission contest to the Bachelor's degree study programs in English".

Candidates coming from countries where the official language is English are exempt from the English examination as long as they own study documents that can attest the fact that they studied in English before applying to the Bachelor's degree program in English.

The ranking of candidates with equal final scores is carried out in respect of:

- the average of the Baccalaureate exam or of other type of high-school graduation exam;
- the average obtained in Chemistry, biology and physics in the high school years in which these objects were studied.

II. The admission competition session for foreign candidates from EU, EEA and CH third countries on places assigned to the Bachelor's degree study programs taught in English within the Faculty of Medicine

Foreign citizens (from EU third countries) shall be enrolled in the admission competition for the Bachelor's degree study programs taught in English, only after meeting the linguistic competence conditions, in accordance with the OUC's requirements.

The English language proficiency certificate is a mandatory prerequisite of the application file which is to be assessed in order to establish its eligibility for the requested study program. Candidates coming from countries where the official language is English are exempt from the English examination as long as they own study documents that can attest the fact that they studied in English before applying to the Bachelor's degree study program.

With regard to the application file's evaluation, candidates will upload the documents on-line by submitting them to the OUC's Department for International Students (DSS-UOC) namely, to the online platform (<https://admitere.univ-ovidius.ro/>) in the International Students' section, according to the calendar established by the Admission Board and approved by the Senate. Documents in the digital application file shall correspond to the original ones.

The files of foreign candidates from non- EU, EEA and CH countries which are declared eligible by the Department for International Students, will be forwarded online to the faculties for the pre-selection process which is carried out by the faculties' technical boards in accordance with their own methodologies and legal regulations in force.

Documents uploaded on-line shall observe the deadline requirements for the admission contest. Exceeding the deadline mentioned in the admission calendar shall result in the disqualification of the potential candidate. The processing and application fees are part of the file and must also be attached to it.

Registration of candidates who have been declared eligible for the admission competition is conducted by the Faculty's Admission Board, on submitting the files to the OUC's Department for International Registration of candidates who have been declared eligible for the admission competition is conducted by the Faculty's Admission Board, on submitting the files to the OUC's Department for International Students.

Foreign citizens (from EU third countries) shall be admitted according to the study documents they have submitted for the admission contest which includes an analysis stage carried out according to the criteria included in the "Evaluation and selection grid of self-

The selection criteria can be partially or fully met, thus, generating scores accordingly. The Evaluation Board will validate and, therefore, award points only for the activities evidenced by official documents.

The ranking of candidates with equal final scores shall be carried out in respect of:

- the average at the baccalaureate exam or other types of graduate diploma exams
- the average obtained in the discipline of biology / chemistry / physics during high school studies.

Enrolment of foreign candidates declared admitted to the Bachelor's degree study program in Romanian and the Bachelor's degree study program in English shall be carried out in accordance with the established and approved admission calendar, but not later than the **1st October 2021**. In exceptional cases (e.g. foreign candidates from EU, EEA and CH third countries awaiting the letter of acceptance, foreign candidates who need to complete their registration file, etc.), the enrolment can be made no later than the end of the first semester of the academic year for which the approval was issued, in compliance with art. 54, paragraph (2)

of the Regulation regarding the organization and conduct of the Admission Competition for Bachelor's and Master's degree studies within the "Ovidius" University of Constanța, in the sessions of July and September 2021”.
